It can be challenging to plan and participate in a worship that is intellectually stimulating for adults and spiritually meaningful for the kids. We often end up "dumbing down" the message or isolating small parts of worship that are "kid-friendly" while everything else is (in the words of some) "boring." Unfortunately, this means no one feels connected to the worship experience.

FUS!ON Sundays are going to be about more than people of all ages worshipping together one Sunday a month. FUS!ON Sunday worship will encompass the full diversity spectrum of the GPC congregation. Not only will it bring together the young, old, and everything in-between, but it addresses the young in faith as well as those who have grown-up in church all their lives. It includes inter-faith and inter-denominational families that are trying to navigate both cultural and faith traditions. FUS!ON Sunday will push and challenge us to be aware of how all in worship experience God's presence; open us up to the spontaneity of the Holy Spirit; give us permission to not claim to know it all; and exercise grace, forgiveness, and unconditional love to those that we deem different than ourselves.

FUS!ON Sundays will include the traditional order of worship and be intentionally designed for a variety of opportunities for people of all ages to interact through song, spoken words, prayer and movement. The first FUS!ON Sunday will be October 30<sup>th</sup>, 2011. We hope you will join us and encourage feedback about how we can strengthen these worship experiences. ### Sr. High Youth Spend a Week Helping Others

The senior high youth group, consisting of 19 incoming high school seniors, juniors, sophomores and freshmen, spent the week of August 8<sup>th</sup> with 12 adult advisers in Adams, New York. They worked with Ministries in the North Country (MINC) to complete three low-income housing renovation projects. One project was to replace the aging, flat roof of a home with a new gabled roof. The second project was to build a new deck, complete with stairs and railing and most of the prep work for a roof. The final project involved completing the railing of a lengthy handicap access ramp for a stroke victim. Each day's work culminated with an evening of reflection and worship. A "fun day" completed the week's work where the youth and adults visited Boldt Castle in Alexandria Bay and Wellesley State Park. Bravo!! And Thanks to both Sr. High and Jr. High youth for their service to needy communities!

On this day we celebrate our oneness in Christ, the Prince of Peace, in the midst of the world we are called to serve – a world ever more in need of peacemaking.

**Mission Focus: Peacemaking Offering**

One of the four Presbyterian Church (USA) denominational offerings. Twenty-five percent of the Offering received is used for local ministries of peacemaking within the church and its community. Twenty-five percent is used by presbyteries and synods, and 50 percent is used by the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program. ## FUSION Room @ GPC

Music floated out of Room 4 as Junior Choir members “fused” their voices together. They were rehearsing for music worship leadership on October 30 – the first GPC Fusion Sunday (formally known as Family Sunday). The harmony of the Junior Choir reflects the harmony of Christian fusion - people coming together to worship, learn, and serve our Creator. Fusion Sundays are one way we will celebrate that harmony in the months to come. The Fusion Room is another way.

What is the “Fusion Room”? Due to combining grade levels, the Young Children’s Committee has an unoccupied classroom during Sunday School. After exploring various possibilities of ways to use this classroom, committee members decided to transform Room 4 into a “Fusion Room” – a place where people of all ages “fuse” their creative gifts.

What happens in a Fusion Room? During Sunday School, members of the congregation will be Fusion Room guests. The Young Children’s Committee envisions art, drama, music, stories, cooking, gardening and much more bubbling from this “fusion” of creativity and ages. Room 4 will continue to be the “home” of Junior Choir from 11:15-12:15, already the site of inspiration and imagination.

We hope that you will identify your creative passion (be creative with the word creative), determine your favorite grade level, examine your calendar, and volunteer to be a Fusion Room guest. 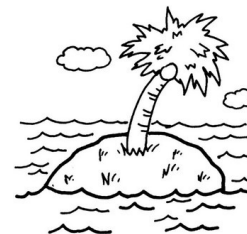

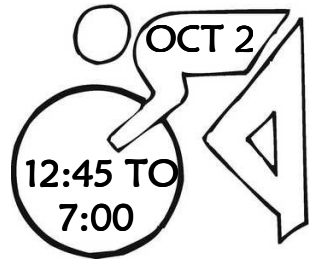
